<u>PELLE LINDBERGH: A PHILADELPHIA FLYER GONE TOO SOON</u> <u>BY: RONALD CRISTANDO</u>

In the annals of Philadelphia Flyers history, certain players transcend into legends, and as we approach the 40th anniversary of his untimely passing, Pelle Lindbergh is one of those players. From the perspective of an outsider born and raised on Long Island in the glorious 1980s, growing up as a fan of anyone other than the Islanders was rough, to say the least.

My personal experience with Pelle Lindbergh came in 1983 at the NHL All-Star game at the Nassau Coliseum. The 13-year-old version of myself was too nervous to approach Pelle before and after the game at events hosted at the Marriott hotel. I found it far less stressful to approach "The Great One" with ease. Although his All-Star

performance was not the best of his career, for this one fan, it was an experience of a lifetime.

In a time before the internet and satellite radio, a young fan like myself would have had to place an aluminum foil-wrapped, rabbiteared antenna radio in just the right spot of the bedroom window to listen to the evening sportscaster deliver the news to waiting fans about Pelle catching one of his lightning saves. I was a diligent statistician who always looked forward to after-school reading of the sports page for the stats from the previous night's game.

I cannot say hockey played a major role in my life, as a young child growing up in an Italian household where Calcio (soccer) occupied all of my life. Only to fit in with other kids did I explore other sports, thankfully landing into hockey. Pelle Lindbergh represented greatness to me, in an environment where Billy Smith was tops amongst other kids. Pelle, to me, was cool. Whether it was his iconic mask or the style in which he played with cat-like speed and accuracy, you could see his love of the game. The feeling was mutual for the city and the fans he played for, to say the least.

When Pelle led the Flyers to the finals, he was walking on water.

Then, in what seemed like a blink of an eye, Pelle was gone. His boundless potential was extinguished in an accidental auto accident. His loss was mourned by his family, friends, and fans. In the aftermath, there was much speculation and accusation thrown around, but in the end, Pelle paid the ultimate price. All that being said, his legacy as a Flyer should not be forgotten or spoken of in hushed tones. He belongs in the Flyers' Hall of Fame, and his #31 deserves a proper retirement.







A quote from the great Bobby Clarke in a 1985 New York Times article reads, "We accepted it as part of sports, and it shouldn't have been. Pelle didn't do anything I didn't do... I probably didn't have a teammate who didn't do what he did. We'll put some rules in now... too late."

Let us pause and reflect on Pelle, and as the 40th anniversary approaches, let us remember and celebrate him. Hopefully, the Flyers will do what is ultimately right by the man, his family, and the fans.






FLYERS FAN CLUB AT THE BANK 7/26/24 BY: BARBARA KINTZER








FAN CLUB CONVENTION 2024 BY: BARBARA KINTZER








FAN CLUB CONVENTION 2024 BY: BARBARA KINTZER










PUCK PUZZLE
